### Sensory Kits and Programs at the Portland Library

The Portland Library is excited to announce the addition of circulating kits and programs geared towards Autistic patrons and also all library users who may struggle with being overwhelmed by sensory input. Nine kits (3 adult, 6 child) are available to be checked out or for use inside of the library; each contains a weighted lap pad, a pair of noise-cancelling headphones, a pair of sunglasses, a visual communication chart, and a selection of fidget toys.

These kits and programs were made possible in part by the Institute of Museum and Library Services under the provisions of the Library Services and Technology Act, administered by Connecticut State Library, and also through the generous support of the Friends of the Portland

### **Caregiver Community of Practice:** Thursdays, July 11 and August 1 at 10:30 a.m.

This summer, we welcome parents and caregivers to join their peers for two facilitated conversations about caring for neurodivergent children. We welcome all caregivers to join, whether your child has an official Autism diagnosis or you've merely been wondering about their sensory responses. We will simultaneously offer a session for your children, ages 2-6, to participate in structured activities. July 11 will feature a lowsensory indoor environment with soft lighting and a climb in rocketship. August 1 will feature outdoor, high sensory activities including chalk, bubbles and water painting.
